- Friday 15<sup>th</sup> February – **Junior Choir** rehearsal – 1<sup>st</sup> Break **YEARS 1 and 2**

Beginner strings, beginner band and intermediate strings will rehearse later in the year.

Chamber Choir participants will audition after the first Senior Choir rehearsal on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> February.

Please collect this form from the music room if required. The return of this form will generate an invoice, which must be paid by Friday 8th February.
